





# Ideal Insurance Mix for a U.S. City



# Statewide Insurance Payer Mix




## Estimated 2000 Insurance Mix for Texas Counties















#### Obesity Rates of Adult Texans by Public Health Region (2007)




#### Texas Adults Diagnosed with Diabetes 1994 – 2005
