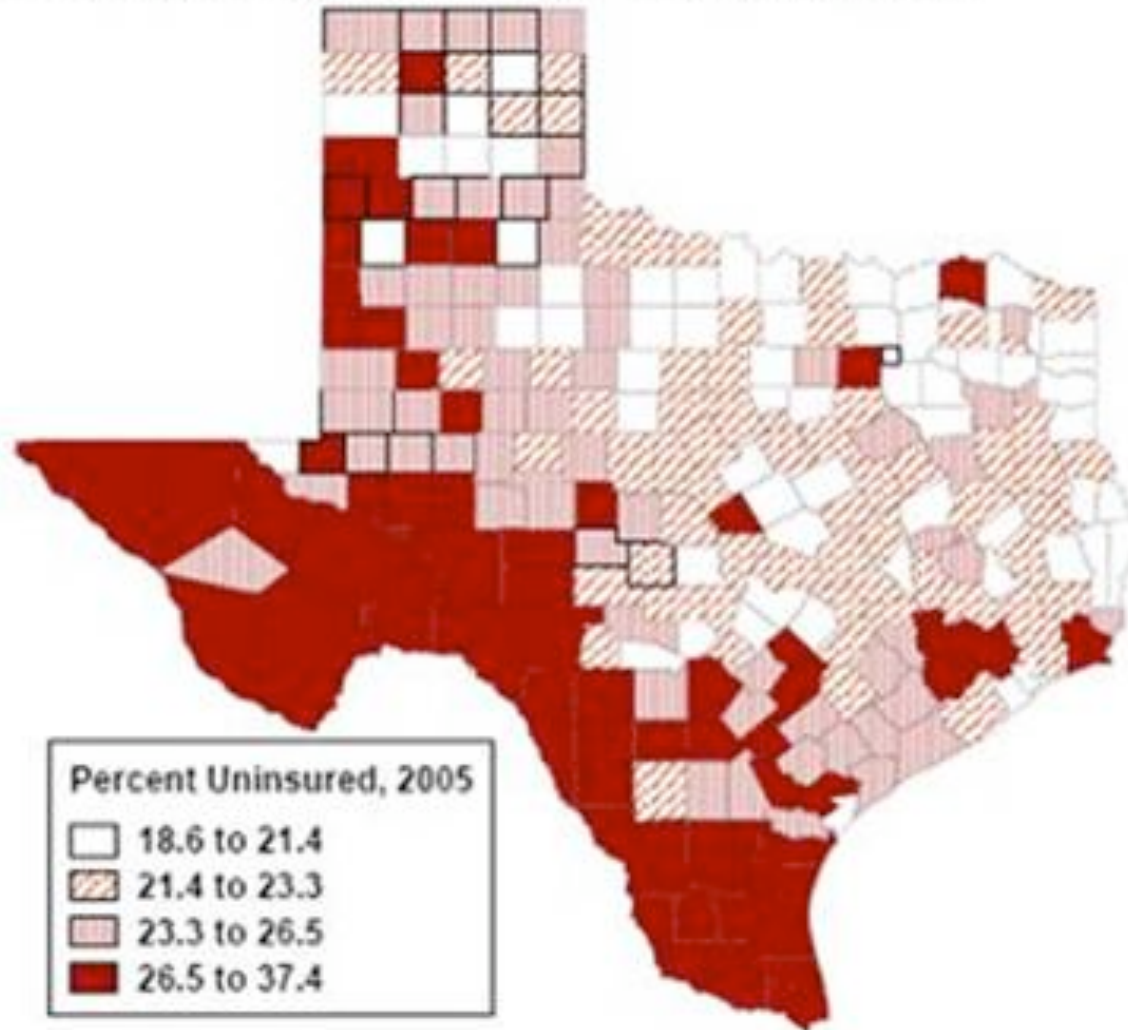

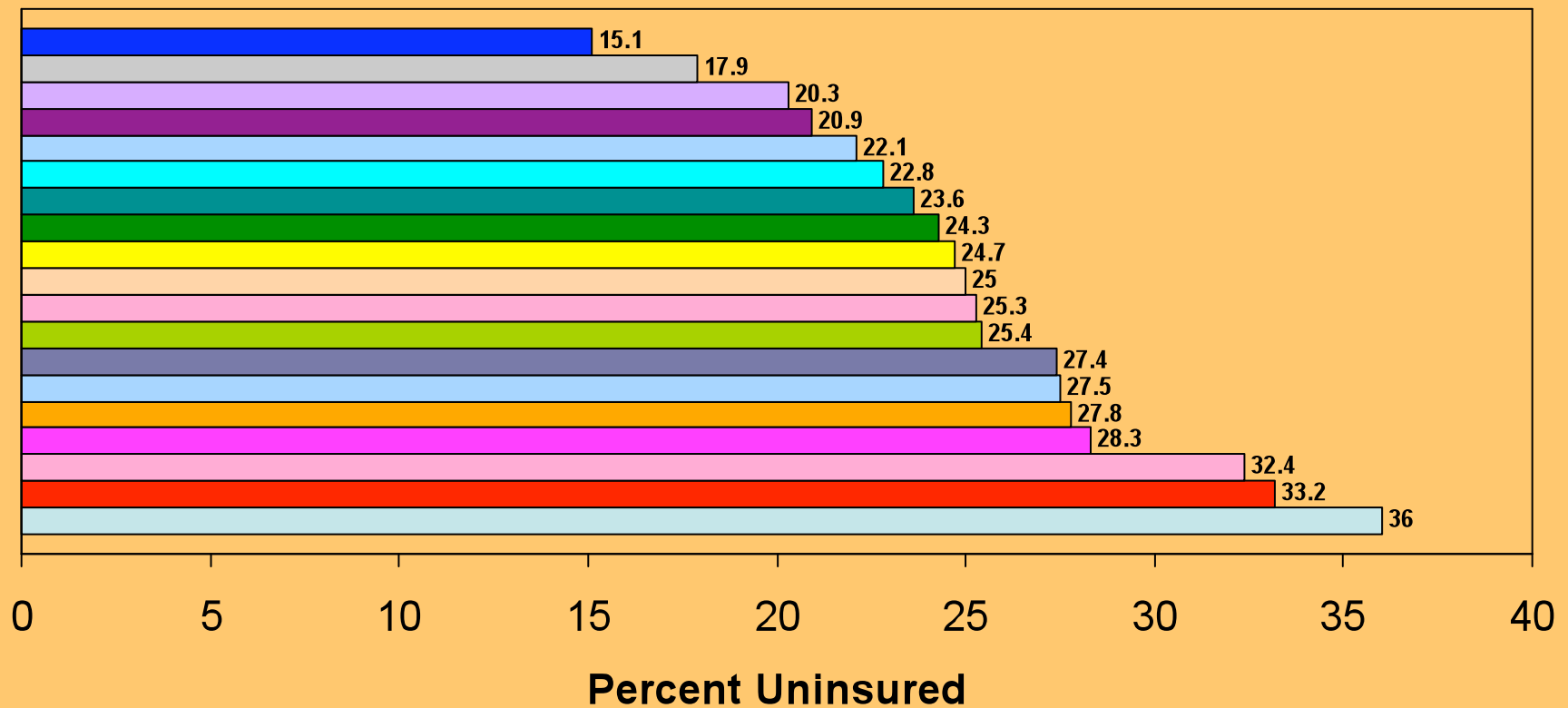
(Residents under 65 yrs, 2005)

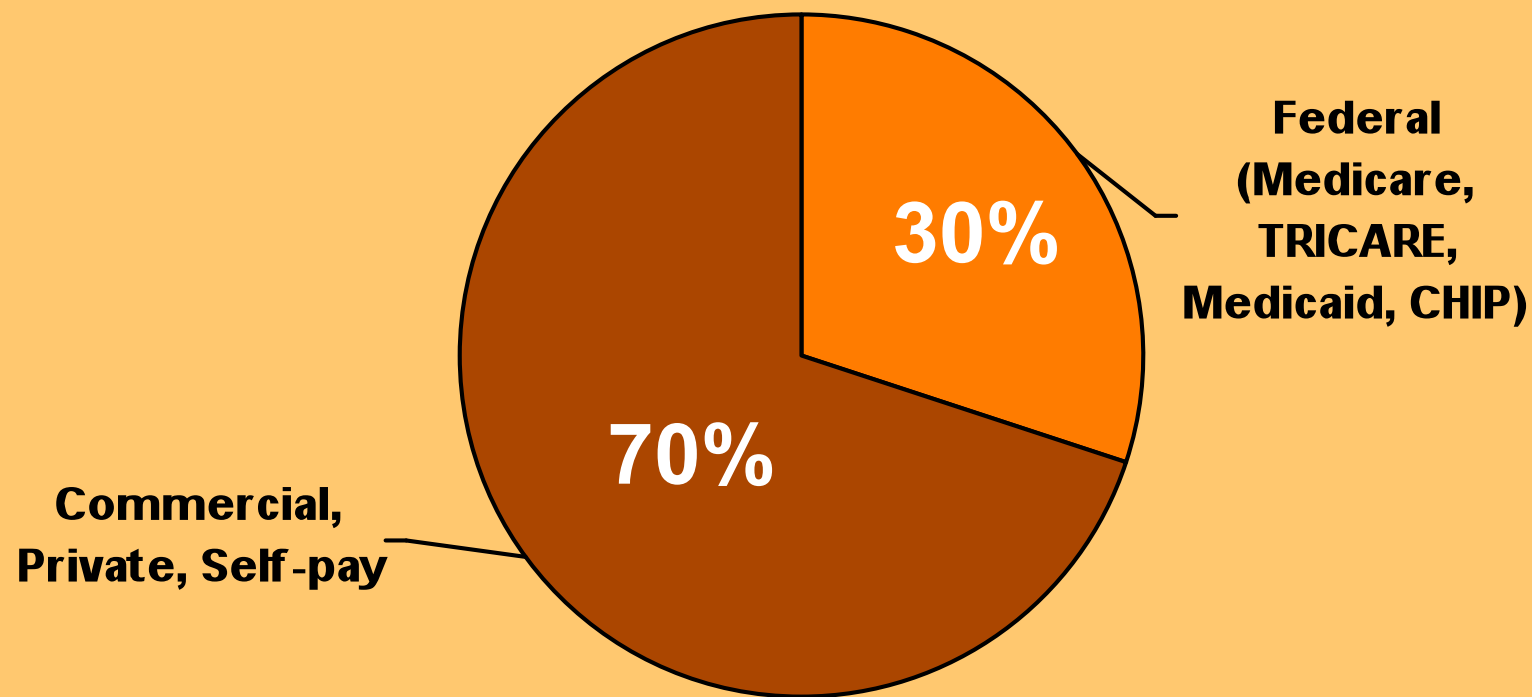

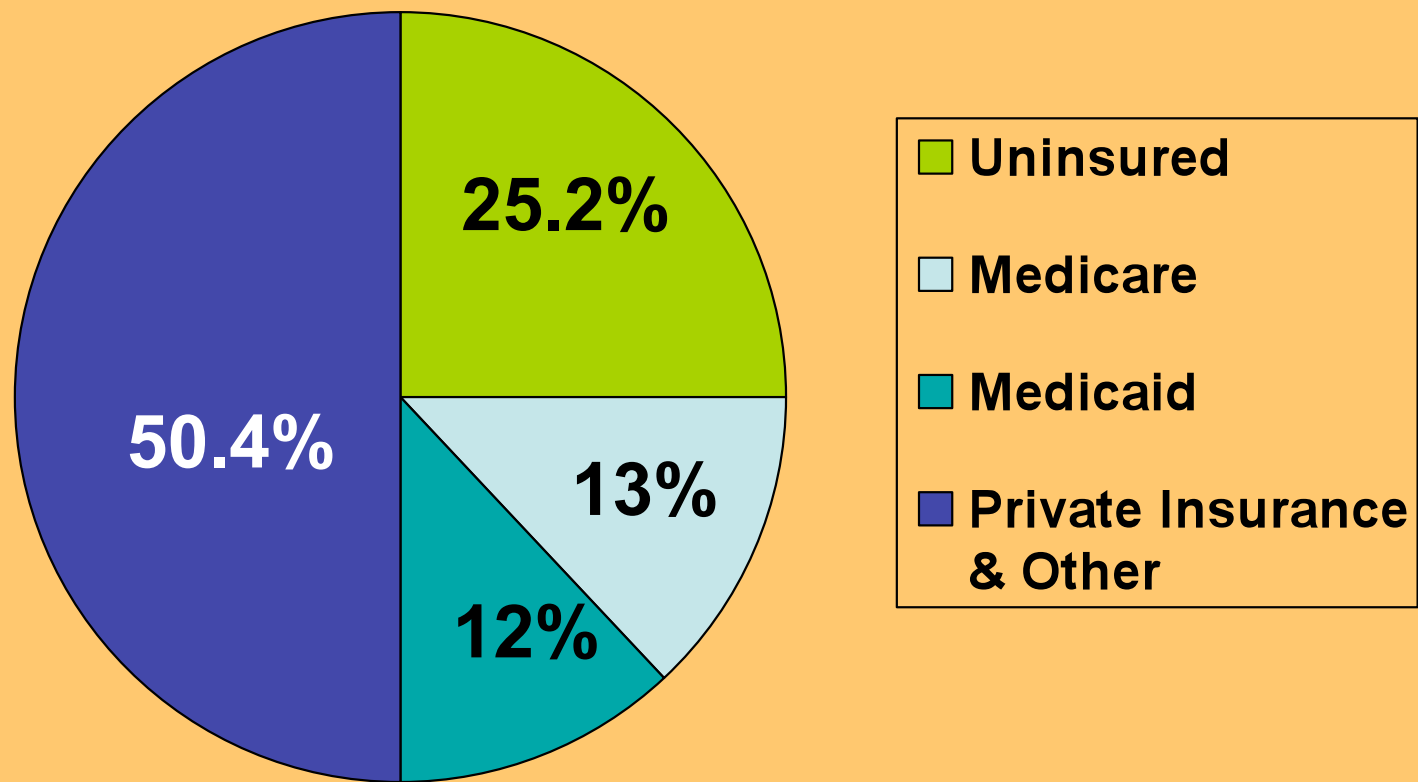


# Ideal Insurance Mix for a U.S. City



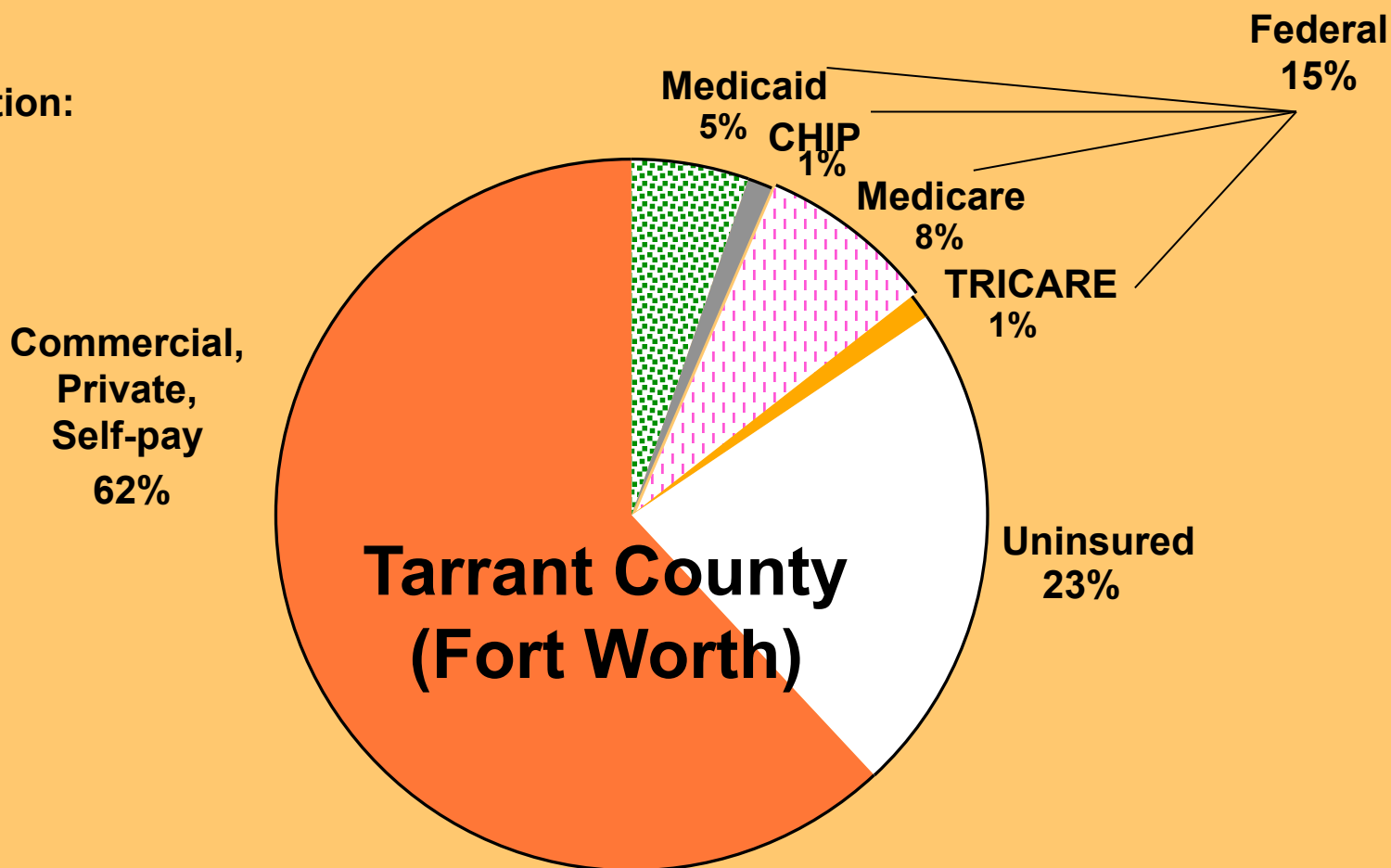

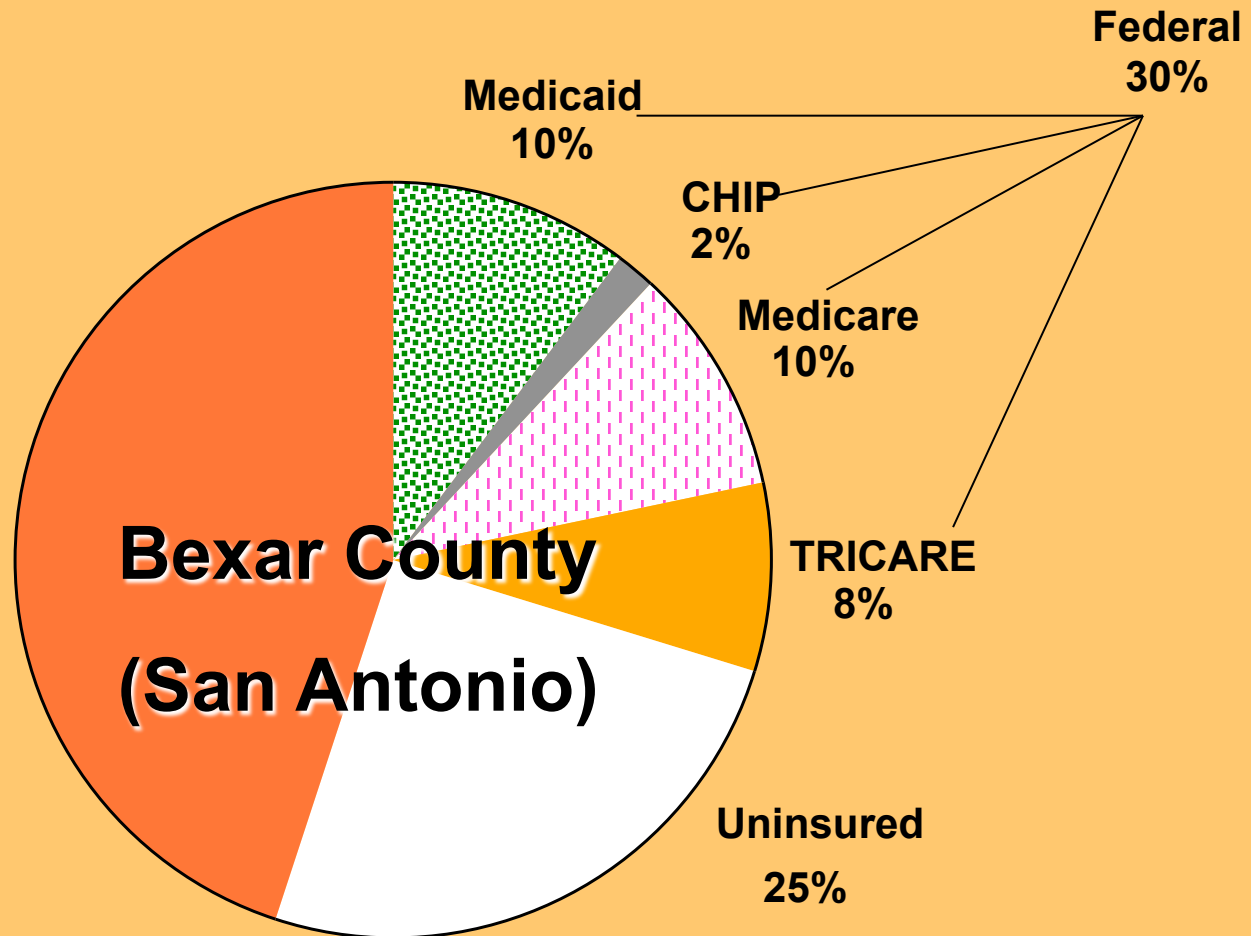

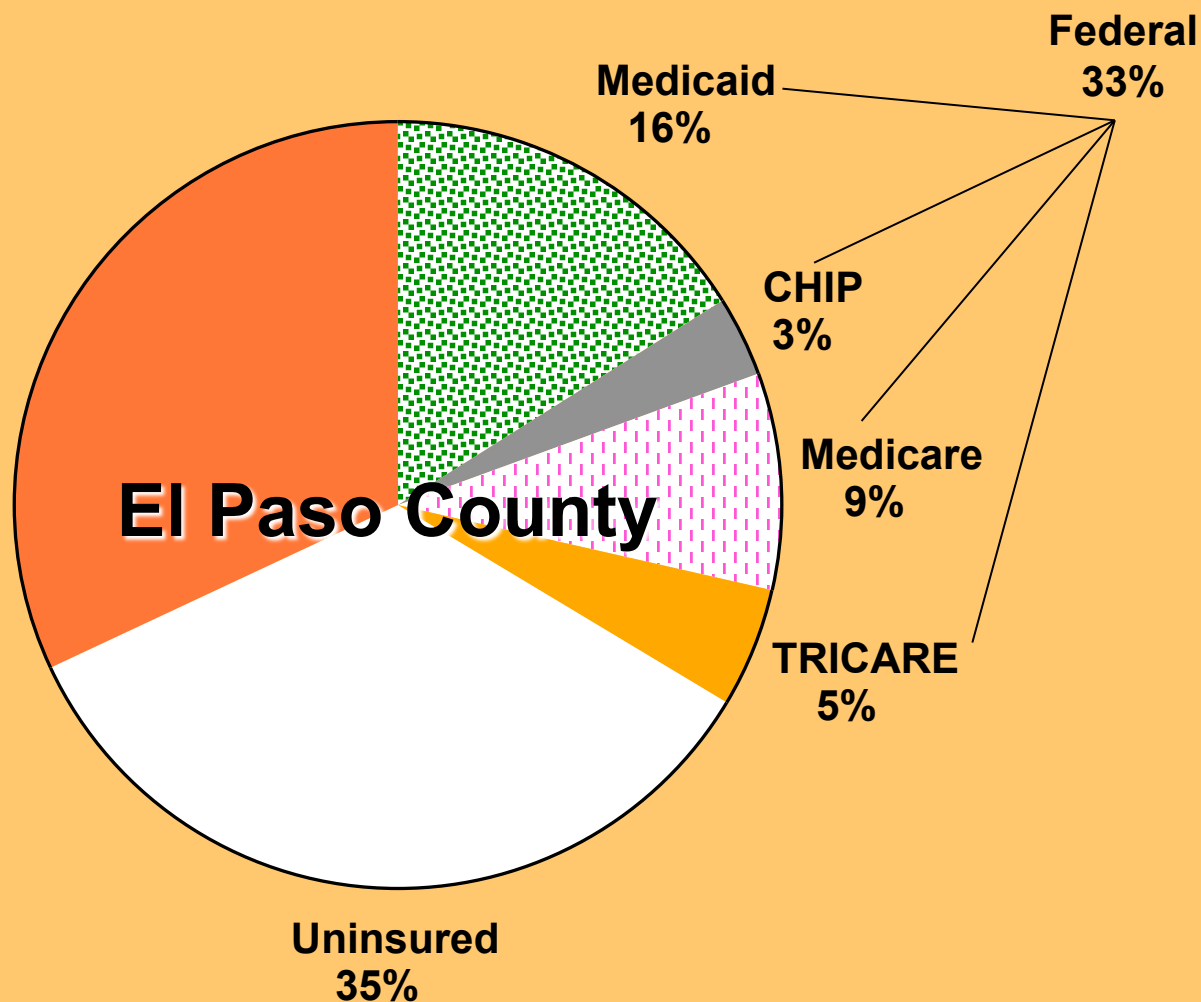

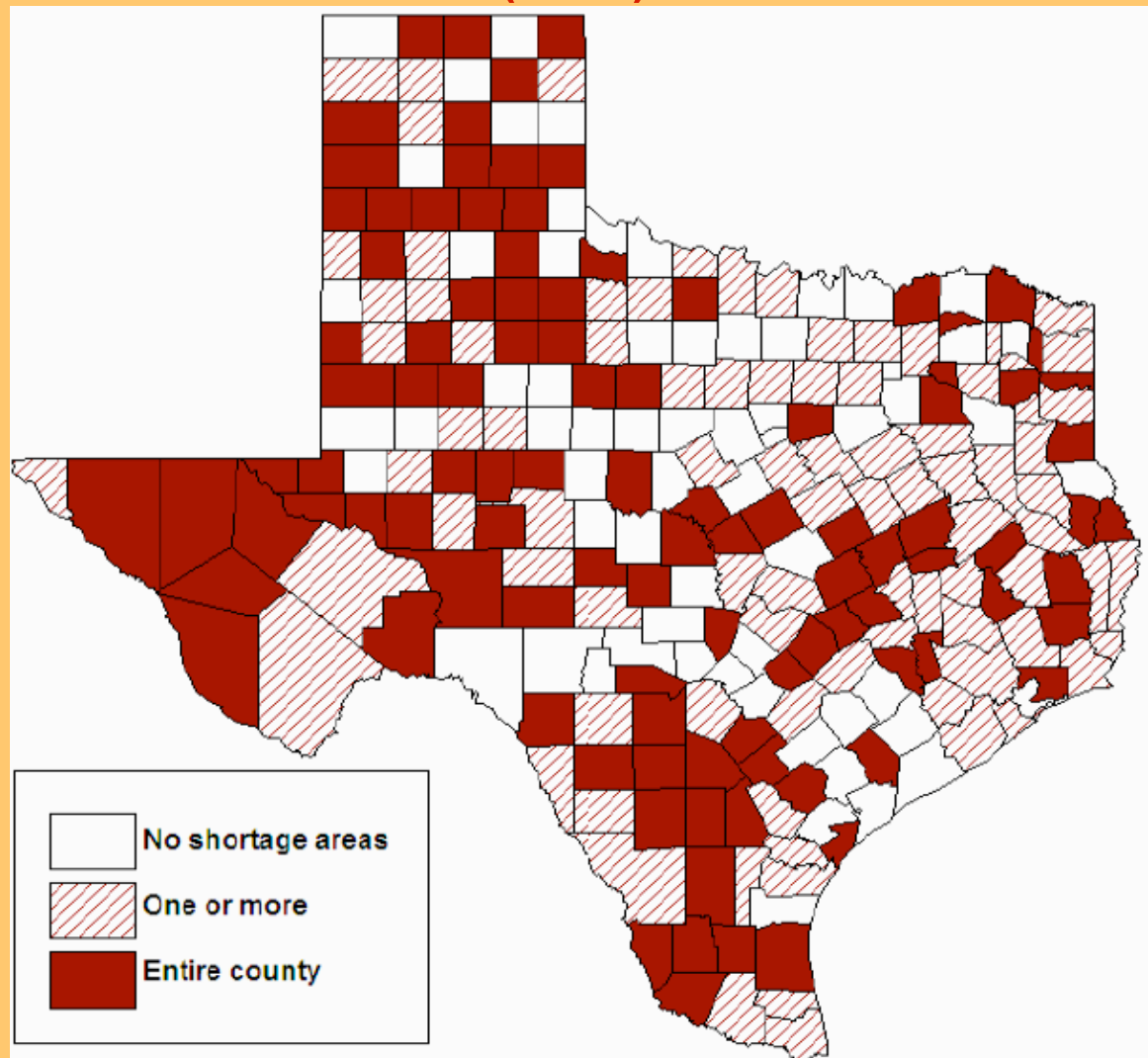

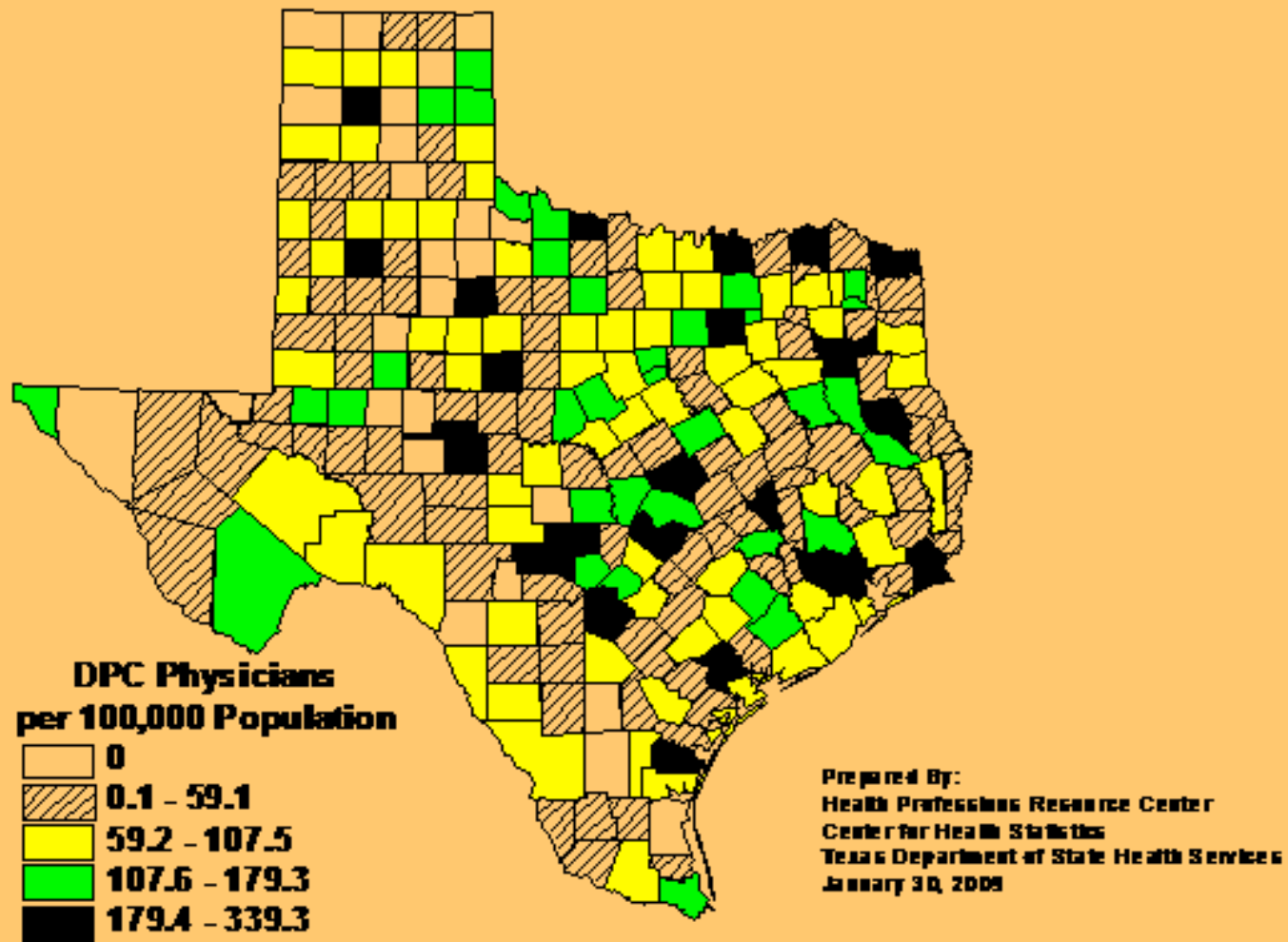

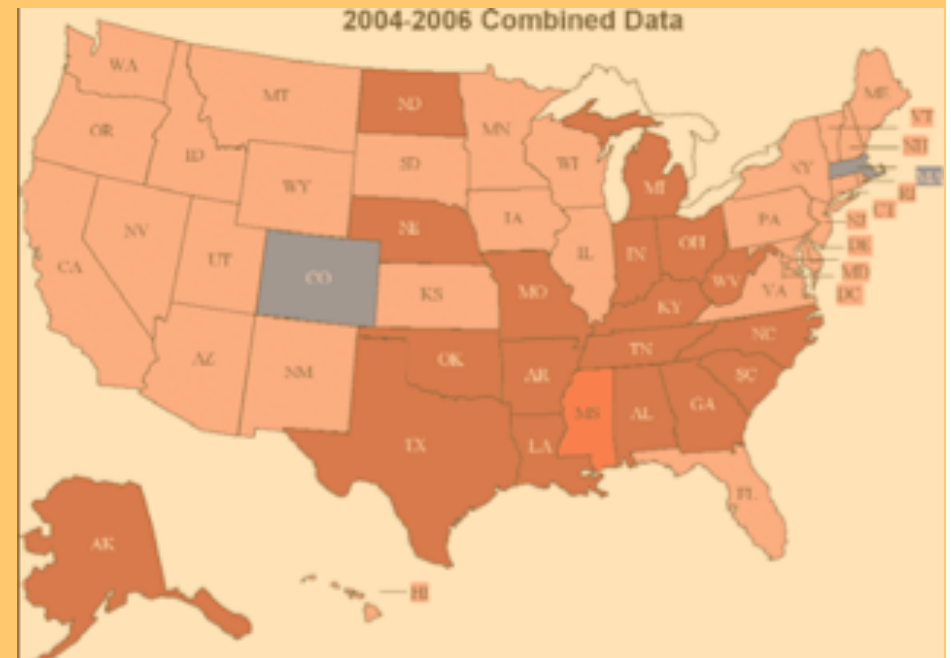

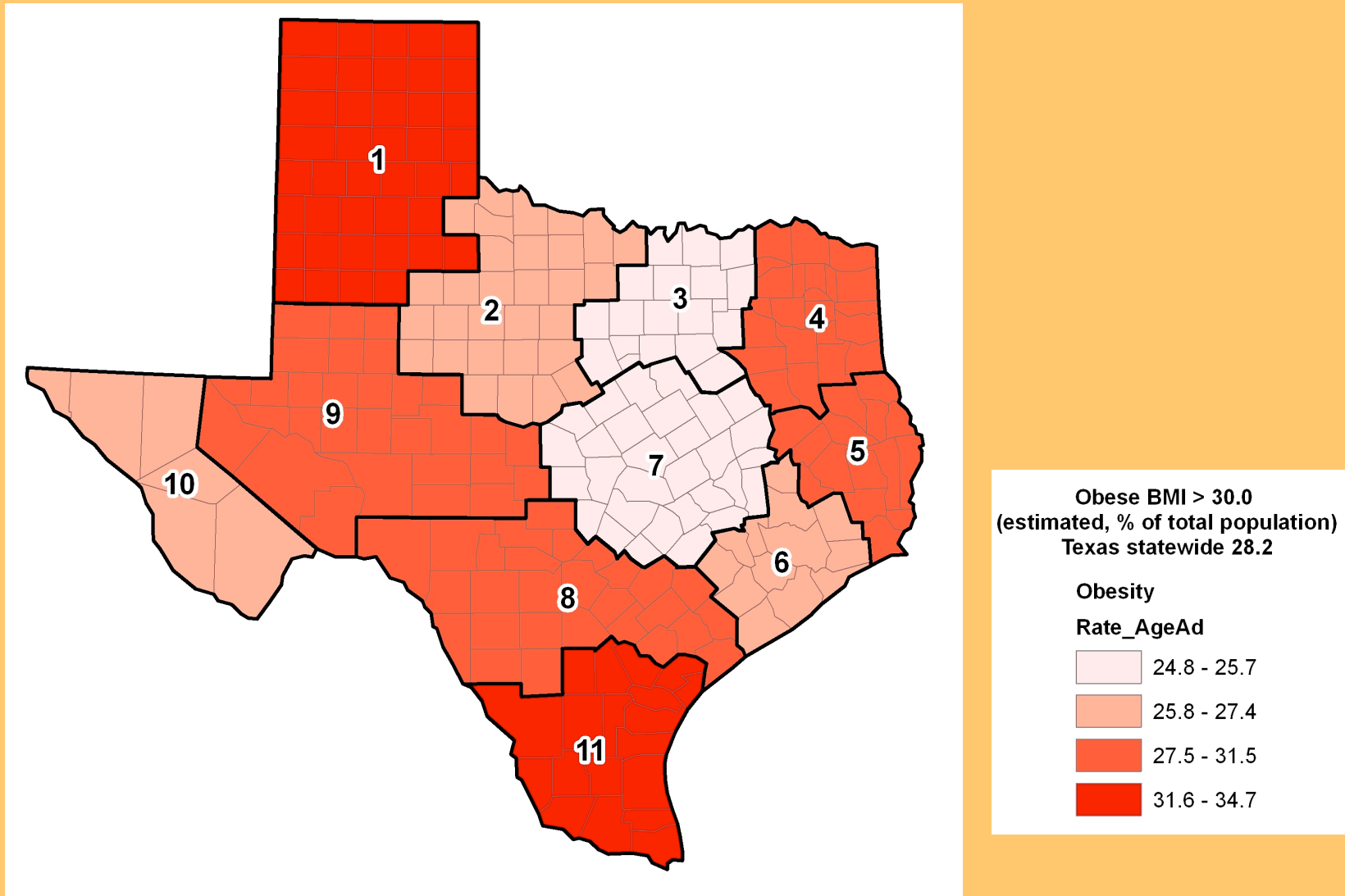

**63.1% of Texans are obese or overweight**



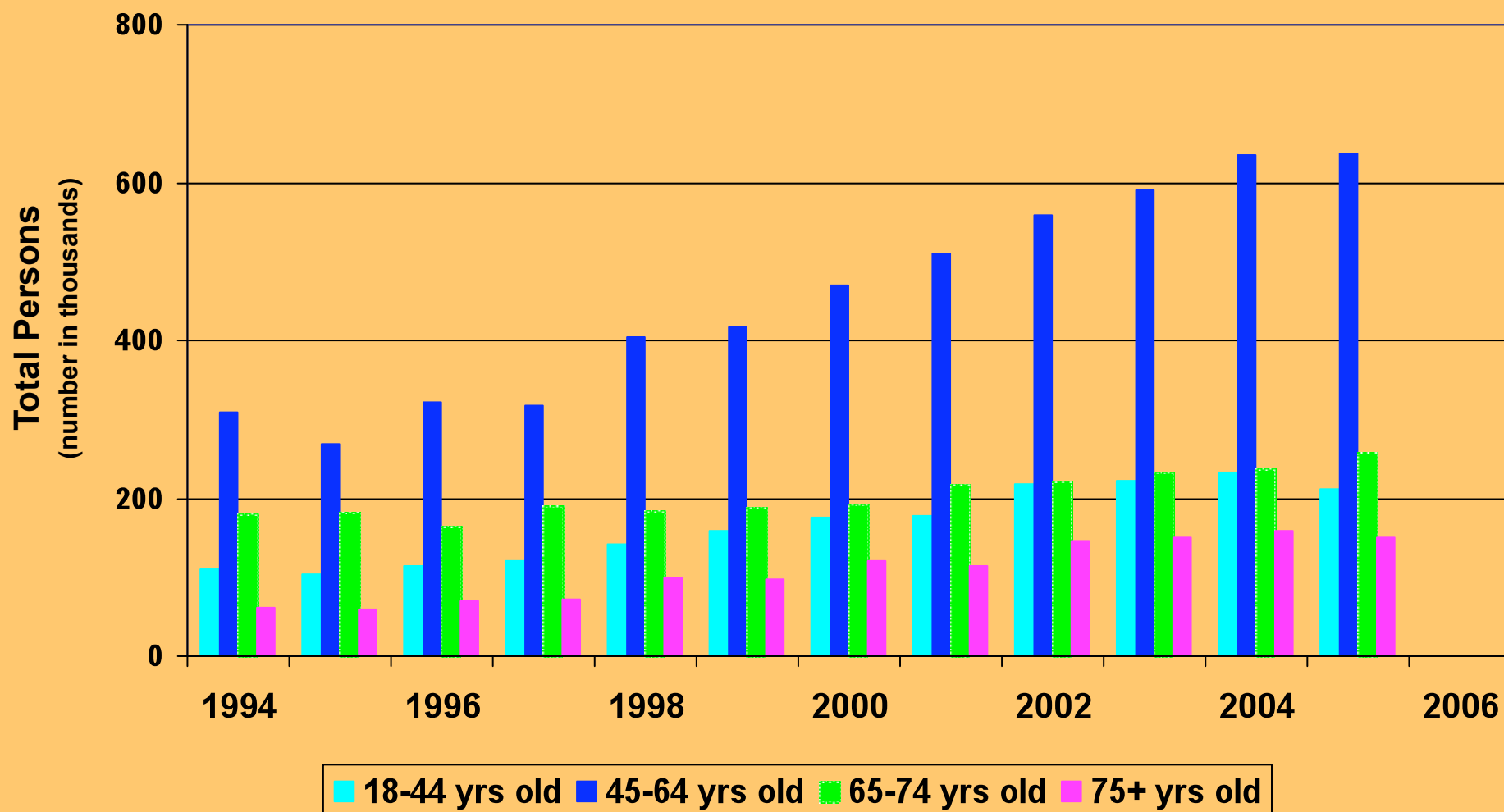
# Obesity Rates of Adult Texans by Public Health Region (2007)





# Texas Adults Diagnosed with Diabetes

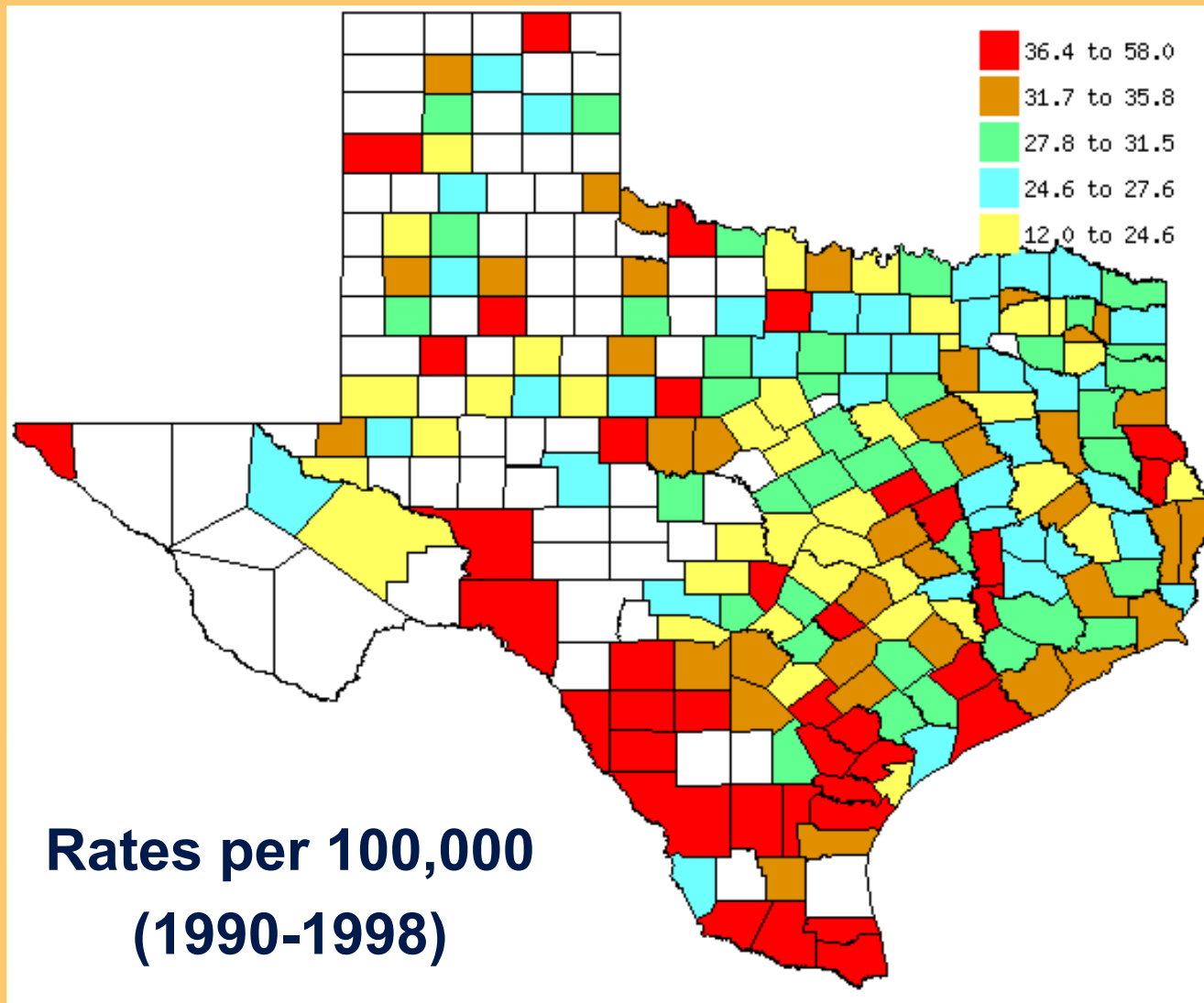
