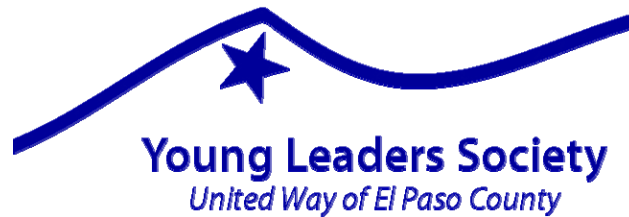

ACTIVITIES

Tour de Austin

Bike Texas is sponsoring a guided bike tour of Downtown Austin that will pass by the light rail station and Town Lake. During this VIP tour, Young Professionals will be able to learn how Austin developed their downtown to meet the needs of urban citizens. This bike tour is mostly flat. If you have not ridden a bike since you were ten, no worries, it is a beginners level ride. This ride will be no longer than an hour. Helmets and bikes will be available for participants on site.

Kayaking

It is recommended to go kayaking on Saturday morning. Life jackets, paddle boats, row boats, and multi-kayaks may be rented on site. Prices are listed below.

Single Kayak	\$10/hour
Double Kayak	\$15/hour
Triple Kayak	\$20/hour
Paddle Boat	\$15 per ½ hour or \$25/hour
Row Boat	\$20 per hour (Rent for 4 hours & pay for 3)

Tubing

You are not a Texan until you have tubed down the Guadalupe River. For a tube and a shuttle pass it will be \$15. It is highly recommended you bring sun block, a swimsuit, shorts, flip flops or Water Shoes, and a towel. It is a lot of fun and relaxing. We will have a cooler available on site.

Shopping

For you material boys and girls, we can drop you off at the San Marcos Outlet Mall or the Domain depending out how many people are interested in going to either mall. Just keep in mind you will be there for several hours. There is also shopping opportunities around downtown Austin and on S. Congress, you may take the bus, or taxi to these locations. A 1 day bus fair is \$1.50 and a taxi from the hotel would cost \$5.
