Reclassification of Sophomores

DATE:

Effective immediately, Sophomore students who have completed the required number of credits to reclassify as Juniors - and who have already taken the 10th grade TAKS test at least once should be reclassified as Juniors at this time. Furthermore, in the future you will be allowed to reclassify these students immediately following the close of the 1st semester.

After consultation with the Texas Education Agency and Region 19, Dr. García agrees that reclassifying these students honors them by recognizing their hard work and accomplishments. Emotionally, this recognition can do much for their self-esteem and in turn, increase their academic motivation. With this opportunity, these students will be one step closer to a timely graduation. Furthermore, mid-year reclassification allows for a more meaningful, rigorous, and appropriate testing scenario, giving these qualifying students an incentive to excel on the exit-level test this February and April.

At the earliest convenience, all high schools need to identify the qualifying Sophomores on each respective campus and email Esther Hughes in the Priority Schools Division a listing of these students in an Excel spreadsheet with the following information:

- Student Name
- **Student Identification Number**
- Number of Credits Earned as of January 2007 (can come later if not readily available...)
- 10<sup>th</sup> Grade TAKS Test Confirmation

Which kids do you personally teach that could most significantly impact these sub-pop goals? (borderline kids in the specific sub-pops would be the best targets).

What are you doing special for these kids?

Please put something together and get this out by the end of next week.

The following step will be to get together your CORE kids from across the campus who can most impact the scores.... But first, let's do this publishing and buy-in process.
